

The weather has played havoc with STARS sports fixtures and the vast majority unfortunately have been cancelled by other hosting schools this term. We were pleased however, to make full use of our amazing new hall yesterday hosting a Year 1/2 STARS Multi-Skills Tournament. A big thank you to Miss Brown for organising and leading the tournament with support from Mrs Talbot (one of our Steyning Grammar School Sports Coaches). The partnership and new resources are definitely paying off!

Building Update

Despite the inclement weather, works have continued to replace our roof and remove/replace the roof lights. This is now due for completion at the end of term along with works to build a wall and erect a close board fence between our site and Steyning's Rock Road campus on the eastern side of our school.

Heaters are being installed at last in the entrance corridor by WSCC today, which we are very grateful for.

We have had some lovely new additions to the library (log bean bags) to go with our reading tree which the children have been enjoying. Outside, the trim trail is a firm favourite. Further playground development plans include a wonderful story telling chair and benching to the quiet grassed area at the front of the school. With FOTS fundraising support we plan to purchase shade canopies for the front playground and a canopy to be used as an outdoor classroom for the rear of the building. This will enable all 3 classrooms to enjoy the area outside their classrooms for learning whatever the weather. This is a considerable investment in the region of £15,000 so we hope you will be able to actively support FOTS fundraising efforts.

Fundraising for the School

Easter Egg Hunt, a quiz night, Bags 2 School, Smarties Challenge, post Sports Day Celebrations, and **Village Day** with a new date of **Saturday 15th September** will all be important FOTS events/activities to raise much needed money for resources for the children. The first meeting for the Village Day took part last week with a good turn out from both our school, the Pre-School, Thakeham Parish Council and other interested and supportive members of the community. Community and Cultural Work

Last week our older children took part in 2 wonderful singing events, one linked to Peter Allwood (the musical director for Sandgate Singers) which took place at Storrington Primary School and the other at Chichester Cathedral (Voices Around the World). They were both excellent opportunities for singing and cultural enrichment for our pupils which they clearly enjoyed. A huge thank you to Mrs Hopkins for all her hard work and commitment to these projects and for ensuring our pupils continue to benefit from such opportunities. We are also very grateful to parents for their support with transport, practice at home and for coming to watch!

Each child in our school is unique, and to celebrate this and moving into our new school, each child participated in an art activity yesterday with Wendy (Have a go Pottery). This work will form part of an art installation in the entrance area, to be unveiled at some point after the Easter holidays. Mrs Hoare has been instrumental in this project and thanks go to her and Wendy for the organisation and hard work on this.

Four weeks with Miss Mathieu (trainee teacher from Belgium linked via Chichester University) has gone by far too quickly. She has been based in Elder class supporting French and other activities but also worked with other classes throughout the school. Her work with our school culminated in a Belgian celebration assembly yesterday where the children shared their learning with each other. We are looking forward to continuing to develop these links between Belgium and our school which will also support our International School Award work. Thanks to the O'Doherty family for hosting Miss Mathieu.

It really has been our hardest challenge yet! Of course, the children rose to the challenge and did a superb job performing in the cathedral. I was very proud of everyone of them. They showed resilience in learning to sing in other languages and reflected remarkably well when fine tuning their parts to fit with everyone else. In order to take our campaign forward, we would now like to work more effectively with all schools in Worthing and across the county, to engage with more parents and communicate the reality of the funding crisis. We are ready to develop the work started by Headteachers and WorthLess?

Aims for 2018 Our key aims this year are to grow the campaign to get more parents on board to campaign for adequate funding for all schools focusing on: - publicising the real impact of cuts on schools - SEN provision - children's wellbeing

Activities for spring 2018 - March/ April: anonymous Headteacher survey to evidence impact of cuts - protest march on 21st April 2-4pm Worthing town centre and chalking messages on the prom - fresh social media approach to extend reach.

We believe every child deserves a good, well-rounded education and appreciate that every penny counts to achieve this. We look forward to working with you to fight for an education that helps children become the kind of adults we need for the future.
