Safety on Site: It has been reported to me that a number of parents mounted the pathway in their cars to move around parked coaches at the drop off point, directly in the pathway of children walking by. This is reckless and unsafe and must be avoided at all costs. We are very much aware of the less than ideal parking of coaches at the moment and both WSCC and I are working hard to resolve this with the coach company. We hope that a resolution to this situation will be quickly reached. If you witness any coach or vehicle concern please do report this to myself or Mr Gilligan (Premises Manager) and if this involves a coach, we encourage you to contact the coach company directly also. It is important parent voices are heard in this.

We are also waiting on a number of other measures to be implemented to increase pedestrian and vehicle safety.

Dog Fouling: Parents have made us aware that there is an issue with dog fouling on the pathway that runs alongside the school and on the entrance to the school. We have made the Parish Council aware of this and asked for their support.

Finally I want to thank parents for their positive feedback on the new school site and their kind words of support. Re-locating the school has been a huge undertaking and there is much to keep me busy behind the scenes and cause us frustration at times! Each day we are taking steps forward to completion of our wonderful new school.
