Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome Back!

We are delighted to welcome all pupils back after, what we hope, was an enjoyable summer. We are all looking forward to the academic year ahead. The school has had some building work over the holiday period and we have our new teachers! Lots to be excited about.

Safeguarding

The Safeguarding Team remains the same. Mr McDonald is Safeguarding Lead with Mrs Hopkins and Mrs Stender as Deputies. If you have any concerns, please ask to speak with one of them in the first instance. Refer to our website for associated policies and contact information. Remember, if a child is in immediate danger please call 999.

Routines

Most of our routines remain the same.

When Mr Goddard opens the gate in the morning, families are welcome to come onto the playground. Please ensure children line up in the correct place. Mr McDonald will be out from 08:40am, followed by teachers at 08:45am and then the bell just after that. Teachers will bring pupils out for you to collect at 3:15pm. Please wait for them on the playground. The usual arrangements for Year 6 remain in place with Year 6 being the only year group that can walk home on their own (subject to permissions being received via the school office).

A reminder that animals are not allowed on the playground as they can trigger allergic reactions.

The gate will shut at 08:55am after which you will be considered late.

Attendance

Attendance is a legal requirement and parents/carers are expected to do all you can to ensure your child is at school. This is a top priority for us this year. We do not encourage taking term-time holidays and ask that you ensure children arrive on time. Regularly missing school or being late adds up. For example, missing one day a term equates to one week which can be an entire unit of work missed. In













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turn, they may then struggle to acquire the missed skills and underperform. This can lead to feelings of low self-esteem and no one would want that for a child.

We will only authorise absences in exceptional and compelling circumstances, such as death of an immediate relative or medical appointments. You will need to complete a removal from learning request form and provide evidence.

This half term, we will begin with using the old attendance policy but by October will be using a new policy. This policy will be explained to you when we are ready to start using it but will require all parents who arrive late to report to office to complete a form explaining the reason why.

Uniform

Please sure your child is wearing the following:

Standard Uniform:

- White polo shirt or blouse, with or without the school logo
- Royal blue jumper or cardigan with or without the school logo
- Plain grey trousers, smart shorts or skirts (jogging pants, sports shorts and leggings are not acceptable)
- Royal blue and white small checked summer dress
- Grey or white socks, grey tights
- Sensible black shoes, not trainers or boots

PE Uniform:

- Royal blue shorts
- White crew neck T-shirt (with or without the school logo)
- Plimsolls or trainers
- During cold months children may wear plain black tracksuits (not leggings please)

On PE days, pupils should come wearing their PE kit. Please ensure it aligns with the requirements above. Class PE days are as follows:

- Wonder (years 1 and 2): Tuesday and Friday
- Marley (years 3 and 4): Monday and Tuesday
- Franklin (years 5 and 6): Monday and Thursday

Stage 1 of the School Building Project

Earlier this year we were awarded almost half a million pounds to improve the school site. This will be taking place in four stages:

1] New key stage one playground at the rear of the school and a new outdoor area at the rear of the school.

2] New special needs facilities in the centre of the school.

3] New rear walls and entrances.

4] A second hall, revised admin block and intervention spaces where the current excess hall stands.
