Dear Parents & Carers,

Sporting Fun & World Cup Fever!

It has been a busy couple of weeks for Thakeham and sports. Children in Year 4/5 had the opportunity to participate in a Tennis Festival at Storrington Tennis Club last week, honing their skills just in time for Wimbledon! Each will begin with a carousel of activities before moving onto races. We hope parents will be able to join us for these events.

Forest School Update

Today we have the first of our Forest School sessions taking place in our onsite Forest School area (Elder class). Over the course of this term each year group will have an opportunity to work on a variety of tasks, developing their skills, particularly those linked to our Super Learning Heroes of perseverance and cooperation. Stuart Slade is our Forest School Leader, who also works with Storrington Primary School. Some small groups of children may also receive additional sessions. Forest School sessions are something we would like to continue to extend next year and will be able to fund some, but not all of these. We hope children will enjoy these and parents may be able to support the school in ensuring these continue throughout the year.

Year 1 Phonics Tests & Year 6 writing moderation

It has been another busy week for assessment. Miss Brown was very pleased with the children in Year 1 who took part in the statutory Phonics screening test this week. Having observed some of these myself, it was encouraging to see how well the children were able to apply their Read, Write Inc knowledge and skills. The Government require that Year 2 pupils who did not pass last year, have another opportunity to do so the following year. Well done to everyone.

Each year in line with Government requests, County Councils have to select schools to moderate (verify) the teacher assessments in Year 2 and Year 6 (alongside the SATS tests). This year we were selected for writing moderation in Year 6. We were delighted that all of the assessment judgements made by Mrs Hopkins were agreed by the moderator, who was so impressed with the quality of teaching and the superb work produced by the children. Mrs Hopkins has worked extremely hard to ensure the children are prepared to achieve their very best, both in their class work and the SATS. This has been a very thorough approach over the 3 years. We now excitedly await the results of the SATS (due later in July).

Transition for Pupils

We were delighted to welcome our new Acorn class parents (September 2018) last week as part of our transition meeting. This week we have had the pleasure of their company again with their children visiting the class for a 'Stay and Play' session which everyone seemed to enjoy. Further morning transition sessions are planned during the next few weeks.

Some Year 6 pupils have been making extra visits to Steyning Grammar School to support transition. A reminder that the Year 5 pupils have a taster day at SGS on 25th June. Year 6 will have their transition day on July 4th.

Body Camera Launch & Wow Project

Following the 'near miss' incident a few months ago at our school crossing, alongside Steyning Grammar School and The Ellie Thornton Foundation we have purchased a camera that Mick, our School Crossing

Patrol will wear that captures audio and video of motorists driving dangerously, or being abusive towards patrols as they help children and parents across the road. If footage is captured of an offence, it is passed to Sussex Police to consider as evidence for possible prosecution.

Today sees the launch of the camera which our (Junior Road Safety Officers) are involved with. Working together with our partners, we hope the camera will help to make the crossing even safer.

We are due to begin a project called 'WOW' which is designed to promote safe and sustainable school travel by encouraging children to walk, scoot or cycle to school. Further details to follow.

Fencing

We are also very pleased that our concerns regarding protection from the stream, on the western side of our site have been acknowledged by the County, and they have agreed to provide fencing to protect children from this to support safe access to the field. Both projects should be completed shortly.

Hurtling through tunnels, German bombers overhead and running to the air-raid shelter were just a few of the experiences the children endured on Monday at the Bluebell Railway. The Bluebell Railway volunteers delivered an amazing insight into how it was for the children in 1940 when they were evacuated from their homes to be billeted in countryside villages, not knowing what the future was to hold for them.

When reading the evacuation stories the children write in school after the trip, I can see what impact this trip had on them and I must thank all the Elder Class families for the costumes the children wore on the day.
