#### **Sustrans Visit**

The Eco Team and JRSOs had their second session with Daisy the air quality control officer from Sustrans (Sustainable transport). We looked at the different types of Lichen that there are growing in the environment and the conditions in which they like to grow. We specifically focused on those that were nitrogen sensitive and those that were nitrogen lovers. It gave us lots to think about regarding being aware of the air we are breathing in ourselves and using the environment as indicators to tell us what is in the air. Following our discussions we then went outside and explored the trees in our own school environment and used the card spotters to find out what types of Lichen we had growing in the school ground. We were pleased that there were good amounts of nitrogen sensitive lichen growing at the side of school suggesting that air pollution was minimal here; however, there were also areas of school where we saw trees with smaller amounts of nitrogen loving lichen on.



Daisy took our air pollution test tubes away which she put in place last time she visited and is going to take them to the lab to be tested. After Christmas she will come back and share the results highlighting what air pollutions were found around our school grounds.

Thank you for your continued support and understanding.


