It is a requirement of West Sussex County Council that Chartwell's carry out annual surveys of the school meal service and the data they collect is used to further improve their service.


Their 'We're All Ears' parent & pupil survey is now running from Monday 18th November - Saturday 30th November 2019.

Spotlight on Safeguarding

Parent and Carer Online Toolkit (Childnet)

The new non-statutory guidance published in the summer, Teaching Online Safety (2019, DfE), recommends that schools 'Proactively engage staff, pupils and parents/carers in school activities that promote the agreed principles of online safety.

Childnet have updated their parent and carer toolkit that will help parents have conversations about online safety. Their booklet 'Let's talk about life online' includes ten key messages that should be shared with children:

"You can always come to me if you need help."
"What would you do if this happened...?"

"Remember that not everyone is who they say they are online."

"Keep your personal information safe, and other people's too."

"Be respectful to others online."

"Think before you post."
"Remember to ask if it's okay."

"Remember not everything is true online."

"The things other people post online might not always show what their life is really like."

"Recognise how going online makes you feel and take a break when you need to."

Sharenting

Professor Stacey Steinberg Associate Director of the Centre on Children and Families University of Florida, has written a blog discussing her research on 'sharenting', when parents share information and images of their children online. Best practice guidance for parents sharing online include: giving older children a veto power on online disclosures; considering the effect sharing has on a child's psychological development; not sharing naked or near naked pictures of children; and not sharing your physical location.

Tackling criminal exploitation (Children's Society)

The Children's Society, along with many other organisations, are working to disrupt the activity of criminal gangs and keep young people safer. They work with the police to stop county lines activity and recognise the young people that have been exploited by criminal gangs as victims, not criminals.

The Children's Society has developed resources for parents and professionals if they are worried a young person is involved in county lines.

Packed Lunch Guidelines

What are the Packed Lunch Guidelines for?:

To help schools encourage parents to supply healthy packed lunches that are equally as nutritious and beneficial as hat school meals. Facked lunches should be nutritionally balanced and in line with the national 'School Food Standards', which hat school meals are required to comply to.

What does this meen for parents?: As the government have set nutritional standards for hat school lunches, we wish for children who eat packed lunches to have the same varied, balanced diet at school. Belaw is a quick checklist to help parents, children and school staff to see if lunches are healthy.

Food Type	Example	How much?
Fruit and vegetables	Apple, berries, carrot, cucumber, raisins, banana, tornata, pear, sucarsnap peas, crange, kiwi	At least I portion every day.
Meat, fish, eggs, non-dairy protein	Chicken, park, beef, tuna, lentils, kidney beans, chickpeas, houmpus, folafel	At least 2 portion every day.
Oily fish	Salman, sardines, anchovies, mackerel	At least 1 portion every 3 weeks.
Starchy food (Inc. wholemeal bread)	Pitta, rolls, wraps, sliced bread, pasta, rice, couscous, patatoes (not crisps), noadles, rice cakes (non- yeahurt or chacalate coated)	At least 1 portion every day.
Dairy	Semi-skimmed/ skimmed milk, cheese, law sugar yeghurt, fromage frais, law sugar custard pat	At least 1 portion every day.
Drink (Schools provide free water)	Water, fruit juice*, smoothie* (*maximum 150m/), semi-skimmed/ skimmed milk, law sugar yaghurt drink	At least I portion every day.
Meat products	Sausage roll, individual pies, corned meat, sausages	Occasionally, not every day
Cakes and biscuits**	Angel silce, jammy dodgers, bakewell tart, areas, flapjacks *(Look for snack sized and reduced sugar/fat versions. Does not include chocolate)	Occasionally, not every day (encourage child to eat as part of a meal)
Salty snacks	Chisps, nuts	Not to be included
Confectionary	Chocolate, chocolate coated biscuits, cereal bars, processed fruit bars, sweets	Not to be included
Sugary soft drinks	Squash, fizzy drink (even if no added sugar or reduced sugar), fruit shoot, capri sun	Not to be included

I struggle to meet the 'Rate-my-lunch Challenge' guide/ my child has dietary requirements, can I

order hat school meels?: Let us know if your child has allergies or intolerances so we can work with you. Faith ar vegetarian meal requests will also be respected. Our caterer Chartwells, cater for dietary requirements where possible. To ask about a special diet please email <u>westsussexspecialdiets@compass-group.co.uk</u>.

What if I don't follow the Packed Lunch Guidelines?:

The school advise parents to follow the guidelines, so that all children can eat healthly at school School staff will continue to monitor packed lunches, along with the hat school meals service. Be advised that our hat school meals meet the Governments School Food Standards and is independently checked and endarsed
