Dear Parents/Carers,

Our School Family

As you may be aware, last year interest in our school grew with around 22 new children joining us. Since September we have welcomed 10 new children to our school (not including usual Reception intake) and next week we welcome another child to Elder Class—William, who I am sure will settle in quickly to our caring community. We now have waiting lists for 4 of our 7 year groups across the school. There is a high level of interest in our 15 places for Reception next September, with families appreciating our small school ethos, focus on quality teaching and learning, our rich curriculum and of course now, our wonderful new school and the resources and facilities it affords.

We also welcome back Mrs Stender from maternity leave this week. She previously taught in our YR/Y1 class at the First School and is now teaching in classes across the school to release teachers for their statutory PPA (Planning, Preparation & Assesssment time). Her usual days are Wednesday and Friday.

Responsibility for Helping Others

In line with our school vision we encourage our children to develop "a strong sense of **respect** and **responsibility**, both within our local **community** and the wider world, we support our children to be **co-operative**, **caring** citizens for the future." We are very grateful for the support families have shown to 2 fundraising events recently, Children in Need for which together we raised over £300 through our banana cake sale (also linked to our Wastebuster Challenge) and the Hurricane Irma appeal for which we raised £200 through running/cycling events. Steyning Grammar School Boarding School students from the hurricane affected areas, will join us at Monday's Celebration to receive the cheque and provide an update on the relief efforts. A huge thank you to everyone for your generous support.





Thakeham Parish Council Visit

I was delighted to welcome Thakeham Parish Council to view our lovely new school this week. They were very impressed with the improved classroom spaces and facilities. They will be supporting our new Community Award (to follow on from the Governors' Award) and we hope to continue to work closely with them on community events in the year ahead.

West Sussex County Councillor Pat Arculus also visited us recently and was pleased to see the school now had access to resources and facilities to further support teaching and learning.

Pupil Absence-holidays

It has become noticeable that requests for absence during school time has increased this term. In line with our Attendance Policy and government guidelines, I am unable to authorise holiday during term time. It is really important that children attend school (unless ill) to ensure they make the progress needed and fulfil their age-related expectations. It is difficult when children miss large chunks of school and it does affect their learning. Please can I urge to book holidays during the 13 weeks of school holidays available during the year.

In line with our Attendance Policy, absences for holiday will be unauthorised and referred to the Pupil Investigation Team for a Fixed Penalty Notice <u>The FPN is for £120 per parent, per child</u> and 28 days are given for you to settle the Penalty. If the FPN is paid within the first 21 days the amount payable is reduced to £60.

Building Update

I am delighted that at last the zebra crossing has been re-located to where it was most needed and the bollards are going in at the end of the parking bays. You will also have seen signage go up to support correct flow of traffic and parking. Over Christmas the pedestrian pathway will be re-surfaced to clearly demarcate it from the parking spaces. Lighting for the car park area and front/side of the school is also due shortly.

Our hall is really taking shape! I was delighted to get a sneak preview of it this week. It really is a great size—the photo doesn't do it justice. Acoustic ceiling panels look great and we can't wait for the new AV system and Gymnastics wall bars and new equipment! This is due for completion on December 19th, we will also have the rest of our playground handed back on this date. We are in the process of organising an official school opening ceremony and will write to you shortly about this.

We hope to finalise organisation of the trim trail that FOTS have fundraised for shortly and are awaiting a date for the playground markings the School Council chose in discussion with their classes last year.
