Message from Mrs Norton

Dear Parents/Carers,

Monitoring the Quality of Education

School has been particularly busy last week with myself and Curriculum Leaders having the opportunity to spend time in classrooms observing the effectiveness of our Maths Mastery approach. This will continue into next week and there will be subsequent phonics and writing monitoring observations. We will also be looking at progress in books and reflecting on data too. The aim of the monitoring is to enable us to reflect on what is working well and how we can further improve teaching and support learning.

Catch Up Support

We are fully in the swing of supporting children through our 'Catch Up' groups. These are frequently reviewed to ensure the teaching matches the needs of the learners and we are supporting them effetively. We are moving onto new rounds of support and you will have been contacted if your child either has finished their sessions or embarking on new/additional sessions.

Reading Volunteers

We are delighted to have some parent volunteers offer to support with reading in school following our recent request. In the past this has really helped make a difference to the children's reading and supports our very busy staff too! If you have been thinking about helping, but not yet had an opportunity to contact us, please can I ask that you do this by Friday 14th May in order for us to plan for support/induction, especially with Covid-19 restrictions still in place.

Staff Update

As I wrote in my letter last Friday, our wonderful Mrs Hoare is moving on to take up post as an Early Years Adviser for WSCC. She has ensured a happy, successful foundation for our children in Reception over the past four years and been a fantastic member of staff, leading improvements across a number of areas. We will sad to say goodbye at the end of July, but know that she will continue to influence even wider good practice and of course her good cheer in the new role!

We have appointed Mrs Usherwood to start in Reception in September. Mrs Usherwood is an experienced Reception teacher who has demonstrated excellent impact in her current school. She will be a great asset to the school. Mrs Stender will be increasing her days to three and will be in class Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays with Mrs Usherwood teaching on Thursdays and Fridays. Plans are in progress regarding transition work to ensure both teachers are fully involved in the process.
