Children in Need Appeal 19th November

Anti Bullying Week 8-12th November

In **Acorns** we looked at the differences between unkind behaviour and bullying behaviour. We talked about how our behaviour and words can have a big impact on other people and how important it is to be kind. Together we looked at different scenarios and talked about how we could be kind and look after our friends for each one and made a class list of kind words we could use.

In **Oak** we explored how a person being bullied may feel and also how to be kind to someone who is being bullied. We acted out some different scenarios and discussed whether or not we felt it was bullying and why. We then came up with some positive actions we could do if we saw someone being bullied. As a class we also had some circle times throughout the week to give children the opportunity to talk about how they are feeling currently and discuss any times we felt sad on the playground and how best to help in the future.

Maple Class have taken their time identifying what it means to be a bully and why someone might bully another. We have also looked at the role a bystander plays in a range of situations and have created posters that will support children to understand what they need to do if they feel like they are being bullied. Alongside the theme of 'one kind word' for anti-bullying week, the children had to identify 5 times they showed someone kindness and how they felt in those moments. We discussed the importance of being kind towards others and the reasons why someone might not show kindness to another.

Growth Mindset Day 26th November

Linking with our Super Learning Hero 'Positive, Persevering Poppy (soon to be Perry!) we have been refreshing our work on the importance of growth mindset, what it feels like when we are 'stuck' with our learning, why this is good to a certain extent and what we can do to help ourselves and each other. Originally created by James Nottingham in 2007, the learning pit is part of what he calls a learning challenge. It is a place that a child will be once they have a series of unresolved questions due to thinking deeply about a certain topic. Each class engaged in a range of learning opportunities throughout the day to develop their understanding of these concepts.

Acorns really enjoyed learning about how our brains can grow in different ways as we learn. We talked about how everyone is always learning and that no baby is born able to read, write or ride a bike! Together we came up with some ideas of things we are good at and things we are still learning to do. We then went off and made some individual posters to show what learning and growth mindset means to us.

In **Oak** class we really enjoyed learning about the 'Learning pit' and gained a good understanding of why learning can often be difficult. We learned that the rewards of persevering with a growth mindset make the effort worthwhile. In the afternoon, we were able to apply this learning in our DT lesson. We made models of freestanding playground equipment for Stickman's children to play on. Often our models would fall down and the whole class were amazing at having a positive mindset and kept going to try and be successful in their model making.

Maple children took part in an initial challenge that involved balancing a counter on one knee for 3 minutes. Only 2 children completed the task at first however after we had discussed what it means to have a growth mindset vs a fixed mindset they were all ready for the challenge again. This time 5 children managed to balance the counter for the full 3 minutes and all others beat their previous times. The children also had a go at a range of activities that tested their mindsets and by the end of the afternoon they were able to support each other and identify how they could improve.





Year 5/6 Football Tournament 10th November This was a close one! A last-minute goal to the opposition in the final seconds of the game meant

Everyone who took part was fantastic, whether that was through their dribbling, passing, shooting or just general teamwork, it was an excellent display of all the skills they have learnt in their PE last half term.

Year 3 /4 Football Taster 23rd November

This taster was highly anticipated by the children in Maple Class. They had the opportunity to develop their football skills and to play small matches against children from other local primary schools. All involved came back really excited to share their knowledge and tell us about all they had learnt.





Maple Storrington Trip

To support our Geography this term, Maple Class enjoyed a walk around the local area. We headed towards Storrington High Street and the children took their time spotting different types of buildings and furniture they could see on route. The children spent some time creating wonderful maps of the High Street, demonstrating their understanding of keys and compass directions. We will be using all of the information that has been collected about our local area to create our own tourist information booklets in class





Mindfulness Garden Development


