Message from Mrs Norton

Dear Parents/Carers,

Outdoor Clothing

Even though temperatures at points have been unusually warm for this time of year, our weather is changeable and we are entering a period of wetter and colder weather. As children will be outside at lunchtime, breaktime and other points during the day, for curriculum learning (especially Acorn class), we ask for your full support in ensuring your child comes to school with a coat.

Community Support We consider the 'Thakeham Family' to extend beyond our school and are always very appreciative of our positive community links. Were very grateful to St. Mary's Church, Thakeham for their supermarket vouchers for those in need during the October half-term break and now they are working hard on supporting the school with Mindfulness resources for our calm/relaxation activities at the end of lunchtimes.

Last week Storrington Rotary Club contacted us with a project they are running to support some families at

Christmas time, which we are sure will be gratefully received.

We are delighted that the four teacher trainees are making good progress with their section of the Mindfulness garden. They are also looking to develop community links to support their work and we are very grateful to Horsham Stone for their supply of stones for our dry riverbed at a discounted rate. If you know of any other businesses that could support our garden work and make our funds go further, please let Mrs Stender and I know.

Catch up Funding & NELi

As widely publicised in the media, national lockdowns last academic year have had a significant impact on children's learning in many cases, especially in younger classes where the building of a strong foundation is essential. Following our September/October assessments staff have identified pupils that are eligible for catch up funding, drawing on financial support provided by the DfE to all schools across England. Mrs Turner, Mrs Jouanides, Miss Brown and Mrs Hopkins are all leading support with groups of children from Year 1 to Year 6. Mrs Hopkins, who has done a fantastic job of co-ordinating the support, has written letters to parents of those due to begin the programme. Most of these sessions are in the afternoons, with Maths support with Miss Brown, being after school.

For each group of children, learning objectives have been carefully identified to address current gaps in learning. The children will be assessed on an ongoing basis but particularly at the end of a half-term to assess impact. We will be sharing progress at appropriate points with parents, but this cannot be on a week by week basis as I'm sure you will appreciate.

Remembrance Day

Thank you to everyone for your kind donations for poppies and other merchandise. The funds received will be sent to the Royal British Legion. Across the school we marked 11th November with two minutes silence and classes also undertook a range of activities. I was particularly impressed with Elder class and their beautiful poppy art work, some of which will be on display in my office!

Children in Need

As I wrote in a separate communication, children across the school joined in with daily Children in Need activities, both in support of the charity, but also because the daily themes linked so well with our school values. The week ended in spectacular style with all children in school joining in with the last 20 minutes of the Joe Wicks 24hr PE Challenge! I hope families were able to join in from home with activities and support the charity as generously as circumstances allow.

Anti Bullying Week

The national theme for this week's anti bullying week is "United against bullying." In addition to assemblies for each class/key stage, the children will be engaging in a wide range of activities to further develop their understanding of what is/isn't bullying, the different forms this can take and the part they can play to stop/prevent bullying.

Staffing & Communication

We focus a lot on our Super Learning Hero characters in school who help us think about what it means to be an effective learner and good citizen, but I wanted to highlight our staff who are also important Super Learning Heroes, especially at the moment. The pandemic has touched everyone's lives in many different ways, some directly and some indirectly. It is no different for the staff. They are all working extremely hard behind the scenes and are totally committed to supporting the children, each other and the school in general. They are all doing an amazing job in challenging circumstances. I know you will agree the support and dedication they have shown in unprecedented times, is second to none. A huge thank you to our amazing staff!

Following on from this, to support the wellbeing of all staff in the school, I would like to highlight that staff are unable to respond to communications by email or SeeSaw outside of their working day. It is really important that we try to ensure their evenings and weekends are for their own families as much as possible. Please can I therefore respectfully ask you to consider the timings of any communication to school staff.

At the end of this week Mrs Ramsell, Teaching Assistant in Elder will be retiring. Mrs Ramsell has in fact retired once before (from her position of teacher at another school) over four years ago! This time she really will be putting her feet up as she is also due to have a knee operation! 
Blue Peter You Tube Channel
