### New Additions to the Thakeham Family

This week we welcomed Daisy into Oak class and sibling Rowan into Elder Class. We are very impressed with how they have settled in and are being ably looked after by the staff and buddies in their classes. We will also be welcoming 2 further new pupils into the school shortly which will take the total number of pupils on roll to 105 (technically our capacity, though there are still 2 places available in Year 2). I am sure families will warmly welcome the new additions to our growing family.

### Our Rich and Varied Curriculum

In addition to their class learning, children have had some wonderful experiences to enrich their

learning. As you will see throughout the newsletter two classes have enjoyed dance/drama opportunities with an outside visiting dance company to bring their RE learning to life; we have enjoyed a netball taster session to further extend the pupils' netball skills; SPLASH through their highly interactive assembly have made us aware of the importance of making time to relax and reflect; Elder class have been fully immersed in a range of activities during their residential trip at the PGL centre, particularly focussing on what it is to be 'resilient.'

This week the choir took part in a fantastic singing experience with locality schools to make a choir of around 300 children to sing and record a song for Royal Baby Archie, telling him about all the brilliant things our County has to offer. This workshop was led by West Sussex Music Service and Ken Burton, singer, choir director, composer, BBC Songs of Praise Choir of The Year and The Choir judge. It was a fabulous opportunity which the children thoroughly enjoyed! Thank you to parents who were able to support with transport and help on this event.



Whilst the official Anti-bullying week is next week we have made an early start on this with children learning about what bullying is, the different forms it takes and what to do if they or others are being bullied. The national theme this year is 'Change starts with us.'

Maple and Elder class will participate in 'Parliament Week' this Friday learning about democracy, the role and work of the UK Parliament participating a variety of activities including debates and the skills involved in this.



#### Staffing Update

Oak class were informed earlier this week that Miss Makuch has decided, for personal reasons, not to continue her contract with us, with immediate effect. This decision, received during the half-term break, is unexpected and not what we would have hoped for the children and school. Plans were made during the break for cover for the class, which have begun this week. Mrs Stender (who has worked in the class both last year and on an ongoing basis) will be teaching the class for the rest of the academic year alongside Mrs Page, also an experienced KS1 teacher on a supply contract until Christmas until which plans will be made for the longer term.

Staff have worked incredibly hard behind the scenes to ensure the care and quality of learning are their top priorities with all teachers playing a part in the success of the arrangements. I would also like to thank parents for their kind words and support in appreciation of the swift arrangements that have been put into place and how well the children have settled to these.

#### FOTS Fundraising-new purchases

We are delighted that installation of our new canopy will take place from 19th November. This will provide the children with shade from the sun (and rain!) on the playground. For 3 days from 19th November the entrance into the school at the top of the steps by the 100 square will be out of use. Children in Oak will enter/exit the school via Acorn Class and Maple will enter/exit around the side of the hall at the top of the corridor. Acorn and Elder will continue with their usual arrangements. We will be discussing this with the children nearer the time.

#### **Morning Arrangements**
