

Our Place in the World - Getting to know our neighbours and planting trees!

We were delighted to be invited to local company 'Tesla' to be part of their tree planting venture and learn a little more about their work in making magnets for MRI scanners through a tour of the factory. Caroline Instance (Chair of Thakeham Parish Council) and Owen Richards (Clerk to Thakeham Parish Council also accompanied us, making it a really local community adventure. It was a pleasure to spend time with the School Council and Thakeham Reporters during the visit. As part of their role, Thakeham Reporters have covered the trip out in more detail.





"We planted all kinds of trees in the fields behind the factories. They said it would take around 3 days to fill the field with trees. The trees were: Oak, Chestnut, Maple and Ash trees. Everyone took it in turns to help plant a tree. In the summer we will be going back to see how much the trees have grown. They put a plastic tube around the young trees to stop the rabbit and deer eating them. As they grow, the tube will start to break in order for the trees to grow. I

In the Tesla factory i was interesting to see how they wrapped the copper around the metal cylinder to make the magnets. Their workers are assigned different parts of a machine to work on. Eventually they put all of the sections together to make an important machine. As the magnets were too heavy to lift manually, they used beams to lift them across the room. FOTS Christmas Fair



CENSUS DAY—WE NEED YOUR HELP WITH SCHOOL FUNDING ON THURSDAY 16th JANUARY 2020

From September 2016, West Sussex County Council have made schools responsible for the administration and payment of hot school meals for children in Early Years, Year 1 and Year 2. As a school, we are obliged to provide all pupils in these year groups with a hot meal for the whole academic year, in line with the Universal Free School Meal government initiative.

The funding given to schools for these hot meals is calculated by counting how many children actually have a hot meal on two specific dates - one on 3rd October 2019 and one on 16 January 2020.

If, on any day during the academic year more children take a hot meal than the averaged number from these two dates the school must pay for the additional meals from the main school budget:

For example: If 20 extra meals are taken on just one day, the cost to the school will be £46.00 If 20 extra meals are taken every day for a year, the cost will be £8740.00

In order to ensure that we receive sufficient funding, so that we do not have to use money from the main school budget, we are requesting your help. On Thursday 16th January our plan is that we will provide **every child in Early Years, Year 1 and Year 2 with a hot meal.** We ask that you support us to obtain as much funding as possible by encouraging your child/ren to have their free hot dinner on that day. The menu is shown on the sheet below but will also be sent out to you via email.

If you are **unable** to support the school, we request that you return the completed slip to the school office by Thursday 19th December (paper copies can be obtained from the school office). **If you do not return the slip your child will be provided with their free hot meal on Thursday 16th January.**

If your child has a specific dietary need that Chartwells are not aware of, please contact them on 0845 603 7998, to ensure that the appropriate menu can be provided that day.
