Message from Mrs Norton

Dear Parents/Carers,

'Our Place in the World' - Working with and looking after our local community

Air pollution is a big problem in the UK today and to help raise awareness, Sussex Air has commissioned two leading charities, Sustrans and Living Streets, to work with a number of primary schools, of which we are one, in or near Air Quality Management Areas (AQMA). They will be working with our pupil Eco Warriors and Junior Road Safety Officers on fun, hands on activities to raise awareness of air pollution and develop solutions to tackle it across the course of the year.

'Sustrans' will work with our children to investigate the two main pollutants; Nitrogen Dioxide and Particulate Matter, mapping cleaner air walking and cycling routes, looking for signs of air pollution in our local area such as traffic levels and types of lichen and working on walking and cycling to school competitions.

'Living Streets' visited our school recently to launch the 'Wow' project linked to encouraging children who can walk to school, to do so. The children listened thoughtfully and were especially excited to meet their mascot 'Strider' who definitely captured the children's interests. We have carried out surveys in school capturing the modes of transport children use to travel to school and further activities and resources will be explored across the year. This much needed money will help fund shade canopies for our playground. We are so very grateful for their support and dedication to the school!




Anti Bullying Week- Choose Respect!

This year the theme of Anti-bullying week has been 'Choose Respect' which has linked perfectly with our Super Learning Hero, Co-operative, Caring Craig. Acorn children have been learning about ways in which we are all different and this is a positive thing. They have designed their own mask, unique to them, inspired by Co-operative, Caring Craig's mask! Oak class have been learning about what bullying is and isn't, making 'Stop/Go' signs to remind them about what is kind/unkind behaviour. Maple have learnt about 'social bullying' including name calling, leaving people out etc. They designed great comic strip stories which we be complied into a book for the library to be shared with the whole school. Elder focussed on banter and when this can become bullying and the impact. They identified a range of antonyms and synonyms to deepen their understanding of respect.





FREE STEM COMPETITION FOR 3 – 19 YEAR OLDS

Please pass this email on to STEM Co-ordinators, Science & Technology Teachers, Engineering Tutors and any colleagues with an interest in STEM

The Primary Engineer and Secondary Engineer Leaders Award competition is open to children and students between the ages of 3 and 19. Pupils are asked to answer the question "If you were an engineer what would you do?".

We ask them to find a problem, invent a solution, draw it, explain it and then send it in; this gives children the opportunity to use their writing and drawing skills as well as embrace their creativity.

We encourage schools to link up with an engineer so the pupils can interview them and find out about the world of engineering. In addition we run on-line interviews where we ask engineers to talk about their role and then the children get to ask questions via a chat facility.

In 2017/18 we engaged with over 37,000 children across the UK who all receive at least a certificate. We are now being supported by **Thales UK**, the **University of Southampton** and the **Winchester Science Centre** in the South region and will be holding our award ceremony at the University of Southampton in July next year. Entries from schools in the South region will be on display at our public exhibition at the university.
