## **Our New School Site**

It was a busy holiday period for the school with an intense 6 week period of extensive building works to prepare the school for pupils and staff. We were not able to occupy the building until Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September and even then we had to wait for deliveries of our boxes from our First School site and work around tradespeople whilst they finished off! The staff and I were whole heartedly focussed on ensuring the school was ready for tours for parents and pupils last Wednesday afternoon and for opening our doors last Thursday. This was a huge undertaking but together we worked as a team and supported each other to achieve our common goal.

We are delighted with our new school site and the children seem thrilled too! We will be thanking key people involved in the project through our Celebration Assemblies. Thank you to parents for all your positive comments. Of course if you have ever had building work in your home, you will know there is always a snagging list! We are working with contractors to have these completed asap. The Food Tech room is progressing well but there is a delay on delivery of some fitted units which is holding up completion. Once it is complete we will invite you in to see! Cakes baked in our new ovens will of course be the order of the day!

Children seem very at home in our new Library as you can see! This seems to be one of their favourite areas and is being used already during reading time. We are waiting for our new state of the art operating system to be installed and staff to be trained, before books can be issued. In the meantime there are home readers available for each class.

Our new hall is due for completion in December, which is when the rest of the playground can be released, and the playground markings and the Trim Trail chosen by the School Council installed soon after. Landscaping will begin next week.

## **Signage, Road Safety and Parking**

All parents have been informed before we moved and once in place on our new site of the one-way system in operation and times to arrive. Most parents are following these and helping us enormously - thank you. A



reminder to those parents not supporting the new systems, please drive in to the site at the entrance next to the SGS sign (same direction as the coaches) and when leaving the car park, please exit nearest the roundabout. This seems smoother in the mornings but some parents are driving in the wrong way at the end of the school day to avoid the coaches. Please arrive from 3.05pm when coaches should begin departing the site. Some parents have asked about arriving much earlier, this may be possible to avoid some coach traffic (though many are in place from much earlier in the afternoon). Again please observe the one-way system. I have been very disappointed that appropriate signage was not in place, which I know has not helped and have been proactive with various agencies to ensure this is addressed as soon as possible. I have followed up on other concerns regarding road/pedestrian safety (and am hoping to report back to you as soon as possible).

## **Communications**

Until half term we have to operate with a very basic internet service at school and this is in the hands of BT Openreach. This means we have very limited access to receive/send emails. We cannot easily access our text service as this requires sufficient internet availability. Please ring us if you need anything within the same day to be actioned, our telephone number for now remains the same, 01798 812133 and we will shortly have access to another line 01798 813586. I am in talks with County at the moment to see what more can be done to support us. Please bear with us - this is very frustrating for us too, especially for admin staff. Teachers are out on the playground to greet the children every morning and at the end of the day, so if you need to pass a message on to them, please do feel free to approach them - they have clipboards and will write down any messages as to any changes in who is picking up your child etc. You can also ring the office with any messages for staff too or you can make an appointment to see a member of staff. Next week there are Curriculum Information Meetings for each class as per the separate communication (sent last night!). Dates are also on the last page of this newsletter.

We are in the process of completing our new website which will go live as soon as possible. This has proved a challenge to do during work hours due to internet access and ability to upload documents etc. to it. All of our school policies have been reviewed and were agreed by the Governing Body on 1<sup>st</sup> September. These will be available on our new school website, but in the meantime, copies are available from the office.

### **Parent Permissions**

As part of our re-organisation and becoming a Primary School, we need to update all of our permissions and there are a few more to add to this. These forms are coming home today for completion. We have combined these together and will need these completing and returned to the office by next Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> September. Without the relevant permissions in place your child will not be able to participate in certain activities etc. Once these are completed and returned we will not need to ask for permission for each STARS sports taster sessions/tournaments but will still inform you if your child has been selected. Trips further afield will still require parent permission.
