### Reflective, Reviewing Ruby

Staff and Governors met recently to reflect on the successes achieved across the year in all aspects of our School Strategic Development Plan—of which there were many! We have decided to link our plan for 2019-2020 to our school values and key priorities will include:

- Improve spelling and handwriting to raise achievement in writing
- Continue to embed our Mastery approach to Maths across the school and our commitment to inspiring Science learning (Working Scientifically)
- Re-design our Computing Curriculum to inspire and engage our learners and ensure we are using the most up to date technology and strategies
- Review, improve and streamline our assessment, marking and reporting procedures
- Focus on implementing the DfE's Relationships Education and Health Education

We will provide further details of this work in the year ahead.

### Fond Farewells

It was time to say goodbye to our wonderful Year 6 children at our Leavers Assembly. What a wonderful group of children with so many amazing personal qualities and wonderful talents. It has been a pleasure to get to know each and every one of them and be part of their learning journey helping to bring out the best in them and prepare them for the next stage in their learning journey. Mrs Hopkins, Mrs Bowbrick and Mrs Ramsell have been a fantastic supportive team for the children and I know the children will have wonderful memories as they leave the school. A huge thank you to all the parents for their support of their children and the school whilst they have been with us at Thakeham.

Results from the KS2 SATs were recently released (Year 6) which deserve celebrating here:

**GPS (Grammar, punctuation, spelling)** 91% (Thakeham) 78% (National)

Writing 82% (Thakeham) 78% (National)

Reading 72% (Thakeham) 73% (National)

Maths 82% (Thakeham) 79% (National)

For pupils achieving at greater depth we are above national average in all areas except reading!!

These results are interim with final results being published by the DfE later in the year as schools can request for papers to be re-considered (as we are for reading) so results may well increase (for us hopefully!)

It is also time to say goodbye to our wonderful School Business Manager, Mrs Mills. Mrs Mills has been with us for 4 1/2 years and been instrumental in ensuring a healthy budget and school! Whilst many school around us have been struggling with budgets and making cuts we have been fortunate enough to maintain if not build on the capacity of the school in so many different ways. Mrs Mills has helped make our vision a reality and without her support and hard work, the re-location of the school and transformation to becoming a Primary School would not have happened. She has been a huge support to the school and will be missed both on a professional and personal level. We wish her future health, happiness and success! Mrs Pearson (an experienced SBM) will be taking up the reigns in September and I am sure will continue the excellent work.

We also say goodbye to Mr Parker, our Premises Manager. Undertaking the role across 2 schools has not been as manageable as he had hoped. We wish him the very best in all his future endeavours. We are pleased to be welcoming Mr Howse who will take up the position from September. Mr Howse is experienced at working in this role at other schools previously and will be a great asset to the school with his strong skill set.
