Message from Mrs Norton

Dear Parents/Carers,

Open Door Policy

We hope you feel your child is settling in well to the new school year. We have always enjoyed positive relationships with parents, indeed this was a notable strength form our recent Ofsted inspection. From time to time it is natural that you may have questions or concerns and so we ask that you please speak in the first instance to your child's class teacher who will be happy to listen and help. I am equally happy to meet with parents too, though would always suggest, if it is a class issue that you do talk initially with the class teacher.

Parent/Carer Volunteers

We are lucky enough to have a few regular helpers in school. They really enjoy the time with the children supporting with reading and other aspects of learning. If this is something you may be interested in, please speak to either myself or your child's classteacher who will discuss the requirements with you. Please note any regular volunteer in school will be required to have a DBS and child protection/safeguarding training.

Maths Mastery

We are delighted to be part of a Maths Mastery Teacher Research Group via the Sussex Maths Hub. Mrs Double and Miss Brown will be the key leads for this project which we are hoping will take our maths teaching and learning to new heights, supporting children to broaden and deepen their understanding of mathematics. We are keen for parents to be involved with this as much as possible so will be in touch later this term to offer a workshop and class visit for you to attend. Parent feedback has suggested that you would find it helpful to have a better understanding of our methods and approaches in school so we are hoping uptake will be good.

Staff Update

We welcome Mrs Stickings to our school team! Mrs Stickings works at lunchtimes as our Midday Meals Supervisor in the hall, ensuing everyone gets their lunch in a timely fashion, that children receive help and support as needed and the lunch hall is left clean and tidy. Mrs Stickings has settled in really well and is a much valued and respected member of school!

Premises Manager duties are currently being undertaken by myself and Mrs Mills (School Business Manager) and cleaning by a contract cleaning company. I have been very touched by the offer of support and help from our parent body with jobs, your support is very much appreciated.

FREE STEM COMPETITION FOR 3 – 19 YEAR OLDS

Please pass this email on to STEM Co-ordinators, Science & Technology Teachers, Engineering Tutors and any colleagues with an interest in STEM

The Primary Engineer and Secondary Engineer Leaders Award competition is open to children and students between the ages of 3 and 19. Pupils are asked to answer the question "If you were an engineer what would you do?".

We ask them to find a problem, invent a solution, draw it, explain it and then send it in; this gives children the opportunity to use their writing and drawing skills as well as embrace their creativity.

We encourage schools to link up with an engineer so the pupils can interview them and find out about the world of engineering. In addition we run on-line interviews where we ask engineers to talk about their role and then the children get to ask questions via a chat facility.

In 2017/18 we engaged with over 37,000 children across the UK who all receive at least a certificate. We are now being supported by **Thales UK**, the **University of Southampton** and the **Winchester Science Centre** in the South region and will be holding our award ceremony at the University of Southampton in July next year. Entries from schools in the South region will be on display at our public exhibition at the university.
