Dear Parents/Carers,

Giving Thanks

As we approach the end of the 1st term with everyone back at school, I would like to express my sincere thanks for all for all your support during this challenging time. Our routines and protocols are now clearly embedded behind the scenes, and children have been utterly amazing across the term, taking the changes on board in a positive manner with a good level of understanding and co-operation. The responsibility on myself and staff has been huge but we have not waivered from this and have ensured every reasonably possible strategy has been implemented to minimise risk and keep everyone as safe as possible, even with frequently changing government guidance. We have worked hard to try to keep school life as normal as possible for the children, but still supporting them to maintain a good sense of the situation, at an age appropriate level.

In fact I was very touched by the children's understanding and their appreciation recently, when Elder class children wrote to me to thank me for keeping them safe. Receiving 31 such letters was very emotional as you can imagine! I have included some examples on the following pages.

I am really looking forward to sitting down to watch the Christmas Nativities and plays that the whole school have worked so hard on. Essential Parent/Carer Help

As you will no doubt have read and seen in the press, children's academic abilities have been significantly impacted on by the absence from school during lockdown, especially younger children where close support to build those strong foundations is even more important. Assessments took place early in September and learning has been adapted to support children at various levels to facilitate their progress. Catch up groups have been implemented to further support gaps in learning and these will continue for reading/writing/maths across the year.

Parents/carers have an essential role to play in supporting their child as always, working together on this will really make a difference, so we are asking for your unequivocal support. Please hear your child read 3 times a week and support them to ensure their homework is completed to a high standard. Homework is an important way we use to ensure learning from class is reinforced and children have opportunities to reflect (like Ruby!) on their prior learning.

Attendance—support for children is most effective when they are in school. With so much missed time last year and if needing to self-isolate for Covid-19 reasons, it is essential that your child is in school as much as possible at every other opportunity. It goes without saying that children should not attend school if they or anyone else in the household is suffering from Covid symptoms and children should not attend in line with PHE advice on infection control https://www.publichealth.hscni.net/sites/default/files/Guidance_on_infection_control_in% 20schools_poster.pdf

Overall we have maintained our attendance rate, but the number of children whose absence is below 90% has increased. We are required to report on attendance to the DfE on a daily basis and those that are missing 10% or more schooling are particularly concerning us, when we are working hard to ensure that children are making the progress needed. NB Covid-19 related absence (shielding) does not affect your child's attendance rate. Our usual attendance letters are in the process of being sent home, so please look out for these in your child's book bag. I would like to highlight the positives, that 80% of children have 'green attendance' ie at 95+%.

Please be aware that should school have ongoing concerns about your child's attendance we liaise closely with WSCC who may suggest steps such as evidencing medical need/intervention in the case of regular absence linked to illness. The past months have been worrying for everyone, we completely understand; the children's health and safety is of paramount importance. There are strategies we can implement or draw on to support attendance, for example referrals to the School Nursing Service, so if you do have concerns, please let us know.

By school and home working together on homework and attendance we can help ensure your child reaches their full potential and is not disadvantaged. Missed schooling and homework means gaps in learning which may well impact future prospects.

Important Covid-19 Updates

Isolation Periods

The isolation periods have now changed, and contacts of confirmed cases (as well as those testing positive) <u>now</u> <u>both need to isolate for ten days, instead of the 14 days</u> it has previously been. This applies to those who started isolating before yesterday's date (14/12/20), when this comes into force.

The changes mean that day one of the ten day period starts the day **after** a person's test, or the development of symptoms, or their last exposure to a person who has tested positive if they are a contact. <u>Read the full</u> <u>government guidance here.</u>

6 Day Test and Trace during the Christmas Holidays

For the first 6 days after teaching ends, on 18th December, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus, having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the DfE have asked schools to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. We have set up a dedicated email for parents/carers to alert us which will be monitored between 10am and 2pm up to and including December 24th by myself, Mrs Hopkins and Mrs Ritchie. If we receive an email of this nature we will then contact you and identify close contacts. Please use the following email address for this purpose only. Covid@thakehamps.co.uk

The school office email will not be monitored outside of school hours and staff will not be monitoring their work emails or SeeSaw/Tapestry as it is essential that they rest over the Christmas period and have time with their own families, which I know you support fully.

If your child tests positive for coronavirus, having developed symptoms <u>more than 48 hours since being</u> <u>in school</u>, you do not need to contact us. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first 6 days following the end of term, we do not need to be informed about their absence until the first day of the new term.

Public Health England guidance states that for most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness. If your child does develop symptoms, you can seek advice from the nhs.uk website at https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/check-if-you-have-coronavirus-symptoms/. If you are concerned about your child's symptoms, or they are worsening you can seek advice from NHS 111 at https://111.nhs.uk/ or by phoning 111.

- The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:
- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia) Please remember to:
- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze

If you need any clarification on the above information and the processes during the first 6 days of Christmas, please let us know before Friday.
