Parent/Teacher Consultations

Thank to all parents for your time. We hope you found this a valuable opportunity to discuss how your child is settling into their new class/new site and how they are progressing. It was great to hear all the positive feedback about our new building and for you to have an explore! I hope you are seeing positive developments in your child's learning. Please do remember that my door is always open should you wish to discuss your child's progress/achievement or well-being with me.

Fireworks

Thank you to the parents who celebrated with us and Steyning Grammar School for our first ever Fireworks event on 2nd November. It was a spectacular display! A huge thank you to FOTS members and staff for their help in organising the event and their help on the night, much appreciated. We are waiting to hear back on funds raised which will go towards playground improvements such as soft wetpour surfacing in the EYFS area and canopy shades at the rear of our school to span the 3 classes. Every penny really does count at our FOTS fundraising events as for these 2 projects alone, costs are estimated to be around £16K. With a WSCC school budget of £4K to spend on these projects—we do need your support!
Our next FOTS meeting is Wednesday 15th November at 3:20pm at school—we look forward to seeing you!

INSET and Staff training

As part of our School Strategic Development Plan we are rolling out training for phonics through Read, Write Inc to staff who are leading these sessions. This covers teachers and teaching assistants who have not received this last year and as this spans 2 classes is quite a undertaking. This along with staff attending Writing and Maths courses will mean supply teachers are covering for a number of days next week. Teachers will leave their usual planning and resources ready for them and liaise closely. We ask that you bear with us as unfortunately it is not possible to accommodate all training through INSET days. Furthermore, as you may be aware, we lost 2 of our September INSET days in setting up the school ready to open our doors on time! The training will lead to increased staff skills and expertise which should have a positive impact on the quality of your child's education in the important areas of Reading/Writing/Maths.

Our INSET day on 3rd November was linked to well-being, led by Dr Tina Rae. This was a joint INSET for all STARS and Chanctonbury schools and was thought provoking, understanding and supportive of the challenges to well-being children and young people face today, and how we can support them in the classroom. We also spent time in the afternoon on long term curriculum planning and leadership.

Building Update

It was very busy in our school over the half-term holiday with work undertaken to prepare for a new power supply, new lighting in Oak/Maple/Elder, painting of doors, enlarging of Maple classroom, shelves being fitted in sheds to name but a few! Mr Gilligan, our Premises Manager was busy co-ordinating much of this! We are also busy undertaking quotes for our trim trail, wetpour surfacing in Acorn play area and canopies to provide shade for our outdoor classrooms. We are hoping the trim trail and EYFS play area will be completed ready for January. Our hall is scheduled for completion on Decemeber 19th. We will be organising an official school opening for January to tie in with these developments. Our Food Tech Room is complete (minor snags completed next Tuesday) and the Cookery Club have christened the room—your cheese scones were delicious - thank you and well done! Again an official opening is due shortly for this room.



Netball Taster

On Wednesday a group of year 5 and 6 children went over to the Rock Road site at Steyning Grammar to take part in a netball taster session. The children learnt about netball positions, ways to pass the ball and most importantly teamwork. They played a variety of mini games and worked hard to develop their understanding of the sport.
