Why?

The world is suffocating under a rising tide of plastic. 1,000,000 bottles of water are bought every minute and only half of these empty bottles are recycled. 10m tonnes of plastic ends up in the oceans every year, damaging birds and sea-life. An operation led by a non-profit organisation Ocean Cleanup is due to begin in 2018.

In partnership with Barratt, Powerday are going to deliver a skip to our school in which pupils would collect as many plastic bottles as they can. After the skip is filled or once a certain date has been reached, the skip will be taken away and its contents recycled. A few weeks later, the collected plastic would be replaced with a piece of playground furniture and pupils will be able to see what their efforts has produced.

Maple Class

As part of our geography unit on rivers, Maple class visited RSPB Pulborough Brooks on a class trip to learn about rivers first hand! Gloriously sunny, yet slightly cold, the day started with some map work to locate the River Arun and a rare opportunity to see some adders in their habitats! The children then measured the speed of the river before searching for its key features. After lunch, we drew some field sketches of the landscape and experienced river habitats through a little pond dipping!

Information from West Sussex County Council Cryptosporidium outbreak linked to Gaston Farm - update

PHE are still investigating an outbreak of Cryptosporidium linked to Gaston Farm in Slindon.

There have been cases linked to individual and family visits and not just school / nursery trips. The same restrictions apply to anyone who develops Cryptosporidium i.e. that they stay off school or nursery (work if the case is an adult) until 48 hours after the symptoms have gone and do not swim for at least 14 days after symptoms have gone.

There may be "secondary" cases of Cryptosporidium in people who have not visited Gaston Farm but acquired the infection from contact with other people affected by Cryptosporidium. Please continue to observe high levels of personal and hand hygiene at all times and especially before preparing or eating food and after going to the toilet.

The incubation period is 1 to 12 days with an average of 7 days. Symptoms may last for up to 2 weeks. If your child or a member of your family is currently unwell with symptoms then please seek advice from your GP. Your GP may arrange for a stool sample to be taken and sent to the laboratory for testing. If your child is now or has been unwell, please let the school or preschool manager know. If any of your family is currently or has been unwell after a farm visit then please help our investigation by completing a brief questionnaire found at the link below. Please do a separate questionnaire for every member of the family who has been ill.

This questionnaire is completely confidential; information you provide will be handled and stored securely. It will help our investigations and understanding of this outbreak, help prevent future outbreaks and monitoring of the infection.
