Message from Mrs Norton

Dear Parents/Carers,

Return to School

We were delighted to welcome back all of our pupils last week and were very impressed with how well they have adjusted to being back at school. From the youngest to the eldest, it was wonderful to see the children's smiley faces and eagerness to be back with their friends and staff. Their attitudes to learning have been really positive which has been a delight to see and hear.

As outlined in my protocol Powerpoint sent on March 1st, we spent the first few days as intended, settling the children back into school and focussing on activities to support their social/emotional wellbeing. All children throughout the school have had an opportunity to talk about their feelings as a class and also complete an individual pupil survey relating to this. This, alongside our own observations will help direct any support needed. We will liaise with parents on this if any concerns have arisen.

I would like to extend a huge thank you to the vast majority of parents who took time to read the detailed protocol Powerpoint ahead to the return, to ensure their arrival times to drop off/collect were correct. I know most will have appreciated that the staggered starts/ends to the day are in direct response to the government guidance to keep children in class bubbles. Apart from Elder class arrival time being 5 minutes later, all other timings and lining up points are exactly the same as when the whole school were on site in December.

I would also like to thank most parents for their support with supervising their child at the beginning/end of the day and not allowing them to run around, climb on equipment, trees etc. In addition to Covid-19-19 safety, it is important than children remain with their parents/carers at all times, especially with a busy car park at the front of the school, where we had another near-miss accident last week.

These arrangements and social distancing seem to have improved over the course of the week and we appreciate parents full support on this.

Keeping everyone safe on site takes significant planning and is a huge responsibility. We are keen that this hard work is not undone by any slips in arrangements at the beginning/ends of the day. I am sure we are united in wanting children to remain at school and limit the chances of having to close bubbles due to the spread of Covid-19-19 infection. We have all worked so hard to avoid this so far, but this definitely not the time to let our guard down.

Over the course of the week one or two parents have queried how they can contact teachers with messages. This and other essential information are contained in our Covid-19-19 protocol Powerpoint sent to parents on March 1st and again arrangements have not changed significantly since December in line with DfE guidance. We have also placed this Powerpoint on our school website under the 'Parents' and 'Covid-19-19' tabs for easy access.

Parent-Teacher Consultation and Parent Home Learning Survey

We hope you found the appointment with your child's classteacher/Mrs Mullineux (Inclusion Leader), helpful in the lead up to the return to school? If for any reason you did not manage to have an appointment, please contact your child's teacher via the office to arrange a suitable time.

On Friday we sent home a link to a parent/carer survey to gauge feedback on how your child managed with home learning throughout this most recent lockdown. To clarify, you will need to log into your child's google account (as you did for parents' evening) to access this. Children also have their own simplified version to complete at school. We thank you in advance for your support with this.

Sponsored reading Event—World Book Day! As part of our World Book Day, we asked children to participate in a sponsored Reading Challenge to support their reading and support the school in buying Usborne books for the library and their classrooms as part of a promotion. If we:

Raise £120 or more our school gets 10% extra in free books. Raise £250 or more our school get s30% extra in free books. Raise £600 or more our school gets 60% extra in free books That's an extra £360 of free books for every £600 raised!

We have also appointed Mrs Young as a Higher Level Teaching Assistant to lead interventions for pupils mainly in KS2, in receipt of Pupil Premium Funding. Mrs Young is a qualified teacher, who is also undertaking a similar role in another school currently. She will continue the superb work of Mrs Mills who leaves us at Easter to take up







a promotion in Brighton and Hove. We wish Mrs Mills every success in her new role, she will be missed by children, staff and parents alike!

Mrs Eatwell who teachers Elder class on Fridays and French to both this class and Maple, will be leaving at Easter and starts the countdown to the arrival of her 2nd baby in the summer term. Mrs Eatwell has made an excellent contribution to our school and we wish her all the very best for the future with her anticipated new addition! Recruitment for this role continues.

Assessment Week

Next week teachers will be undertaking assessments in Reading/Spelling/Writing and Maths to help assess progress during what we all recognise has been a tricky time throughout lockdown. Outcomes will help identify learning gaps and fine-tune or identify support as needed. This may be in class, which will help shape teaching and learning and or may have an impact on the make-up of our 'Catch Up' groups that take place in the afternoons/after school. If your child is identified as needing further support, we will of course let you know.

Finally we would like to share with you on the next few pages, how the children celebrated our 'Cooperative Caring Craig Day on 11th February. This was linked to the ideas of healthy minds and bodies and drew on the theme from Children's Mental Health Week 'Express Yourself.'
