Curriculum Enrichment

As you will see later in this newsletter, classes have been making the most of local links to enrich and deepen children's learning. Whether it be through a visiting author, Forest Schools sessions, RSPB visits or local charities such as 'Living Streets' or 'Sustrans', children are learning valuable skills and knowledge, not just about their current curriculum work but also life skills and about the world around them. Children really enjoy these sessions and many are provided free of charge.

Mastery

We are delighted to be part of a STARS group of schools working together to improve children's understanding and skills in Maths. You may well have heard about a 'Mastery' approach to Maths, which is focussed on children developing a deep, secure understanding of mathematical concepts throughout their journey through primary school. It draws on approaches used in high achieving countries such as Singapore and Shanghai including '5 big ideas.'

Miss Brown is our Lead Teacher for Mastery and is attending on going training throughout the year, supported by a locality Mastery Specialist. She is working alongside our classteachers and TAs to trial the Mastery approaches in order for us to create our own Thakeham approach to Mastery. The impact of this has been very positive so far. Mastery is ordered by the Department for Education

been very positive so far. Mastery is endorsed by the Department for Education, Ofsted and NCETM (National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mastery).

We would like to offer parents opportunities throughout the year to learn about this approach and understand how this works at Thakeham, which I hope you will be able to take advantage of.

He then worked with Maple and Elder class talking through his novel Max and the Millions. Many children were then able to purchase a signed copy of one of Ross's novels. It was a great opportunity for the children to meet an author and get an insight into his work.

Year 5 & 6 Basketball Tournament

A group of 6 year 5 and 6 students went to Steyning Grammar to take part in a basketball tournament against other STARS schools. What stood out the most was their teamwork and concentration during each game. They finished 4th overall but all with high scoring games and a one point difference between the next position.

Air Quality Day

The Eco Warriors and Junior Road Safety Officers have had a busy time campaigning for cleaner air around our school. Led by Bettina Reynolds from the charity 'Living Streets', they learnt what happens when car engines are left on whilst stationary (called 'idling') and the harmful gases this releases into the air.

They created posters to encourage drivers to switch off their engines and highlighted the issues to parents at the end of the day on the playground. Parents were very impressed with the children's confidence and knowledge and I am sure will really think about the information!

As part of the day the whole school participated in an assembly led by Bettina about air pollution and engine idling.

You will recall that Sustrans have also been working with the Eco Warriors and the JRSOs on air pollution over the past few months. They are delighted to share with parents some key messages and things they have learnt in a special assembly on Friday 15th February ay 11:30am—all welcome!

Elder Class



RSPB

Elder class has recently taken part, alongside representatives from the RSPB at Pulborough Brooks, a fascinating investigation into our local flora and fauna around our school. Led by the experts, they looked for animal evidence such as trails, discarded shells, droppings and habitats as well identifying and reporting on all the different British common birds in the area. It was a fascinating afternoon of scientific investigation which has greatly supported our science and geography work on biomes.

Forest School

Elder Class have had a great couple of weeks out at our Forest School. Led by Stuart, the children have explored the area - again, focusing on our science and geography topic of biomes - looking for evidence. They have lit group and individual fires, enjoyed hot chocolate and played a range of games which support their work on Cooperative Caring Craig.
