Message from Mrs Norton



Dear Parents/Carers,

Summer Weather

At last the summer is here! After what seems like an endless deluge of rain we are at last enjoying the sunshine and blue skies! Please ensure your child comes to school with sun cream on and a sun hat. They can bring sun cream with them to re-apply, for example at lunchtime, but they must be able to apply this themselves as we are not permitted to do so. We have more shade available on the playground now, thanks to the fundraising efforts of FOTS and some school funding and we are looking forward to purchasing another

sun canopy with the proceeds of the Village Day alongside some school funding, to be installed early in the autumn term.

Please also ensure your child comes to school with a water bottle. If possible it would be good to consider the impact on the environment of single-use plastics and if you have not already done so please consider environmentally friendly alternatives.

Absence from school

There has been a noticeable increase in the number of requests for absence due to holiday from school. Headteachers are unable to grant **any** leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. If the leave is granted, they should determine the number of school days a child can be away from school. Examples of this would be:

- an organised educational course
- an organised sports competition or approved public performance
- a music or dance exam
- funeral of an immediate relative 2 days
- religious observation on days officially set apart by the religious body to which the parents belong 1 day
- close family wedding 1 day
- medical appointments which cannot be arranged outside the school day.

Genuine illness will be authorised, although the school reserves the right to ask for medical clarification if a child's medical absences are above the amount expected for a usually healthy child.

Fixed Penalty Notice

Parents/carers should be aware that STARS Network of Schools will follow the West Sussex County Council guidelines on issuing Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN) and unauthorised absence of 10 sessions or more (each half day counts as one session) which could result in the issuing of a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) by the County Pupil Entitlement: Investigation team. On DfE guidance, any unauthorised holidays of five consecutive days or more will be referred to the County resulting in the issuing of a FPN.

A Fixed Penalty Notice gives the parents/carers the opportunity to discharge themselves of their legal responsibility if a £120 fine is paid (per adult with parental responsibility for each child) within 28 days or £60 if paid within 21 days of the date the Notice was issued. Failure to pay the FPN may result in a prosecution under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996. Parents/carers who are prosecuted for the non-payment of an FPN will receive a criminal record unless evidence is provided to show that no offence has been committed.

It is important to note that unauthorised absence of 10 school sessions can also be eligible for a FPN within a 10 school week period (not just consecutive days).

- Pupils are **only** in school for 190 days each year.
- There are 175 other days for holidays and other activities.
- 80% attendance represents 1 day off a week.
- 90% attendance represents 1 day off per fortnight.

Please note pupils whose attendance is below 90% are classed by the Department for Education as persistent absentees and we are required to submit pupil data to the DfE and WSCC regarding this each term.

STARS Challenge

The weather was perfect as was their attitude, displaying characteristics of all 4 Super Learning Heroes on the way! It was my pleasure to accompany them on the challenge and spend the day in their company. How lucky we are to have such wonderful children in our school! The boys were awarded a STARS Challenge certificate and a well-deserved Headteacher Award for their all round excellent attitude and perseverance. Photos are being compiled into a slideshow for us which we hope to share as soon as received.

SPLASH

We were delighted to welcome SPLASH back to our school to lead an assembly for the whole-school. We are aware there has been tough competition for places at Thakeham over the past couple of years, particularly in Reception. WSCC delete the waiting lists after 1 term for Reception. We will have 2 places available in what will be Year 1 from September, if you are aware of anyone seeking a place, the school office and Admissions can be contacted to find out more. Further up the school in Years 4, 5 and 6 we are full, but we will have 1 place in Year 2 and possibly 2 places in Year 3.

Dates reminders

We will be sending home raffle tickets for the children's raffle this week which we hope you will support generously. If you cannot join us on at Village Day, purchasing raffle tickets will be a great opportunity to show your support of the school.

In memory of what would have been Ellie Thornton's 14th Birthday, we will be holding a 'danceathon' on Weds 10th July, to raise money for the Chestnut Tree House appeal and The Ellie Thornton Trust. Many of you will be aware that Ellie was a former Thakeham pupil who sadly was knocked over and killed in March 2017. Each class will be dancing to songs they have selected non-stop for a set time as linked to their age group. It will be a great opportunity for the children to have fun and raise important funds for 2 very important charities. We ask that each child bring in a suggested £1 donation.
